### Every Parent a Supportive Partner

During our parents' briefing in Term 1, we shared on information regarding insights on supporting your child. With a closer partnership between the school and families, students will have the necessary support to equip themselves to be successful in their education journey. In NBPS, we will continue to work closely with you and further strengthen our partnership to support your child's learning.

We would also like to reiterate the importance of your child's regular attendance and active participation in all school activities. Teaching and learning can only take place effectively if a child is present for school regularly. Students are not allowed to leave the school during their lunch breaks on the day(s) they have after school programmes. Students are reminded to bring their CCA equipment and consume their lunch in school on these days. We seek your cooperation as parents to ensure that your child is in school daily so that he/she may achieve his/her learning potential. Any absence from school must be supported by a medical certificate or letter from parents.

## Recess & Snack Time

The school conducted a survey for students and teachers and the findings indicated that majority of the students and teachers prefer the current arrangement with having the snack time first before the recess. This will ensure that the nutritious food prepared from home remains fresh when the students consume them in the earlier part of the day. Hence, the snack time schedule will remain as follows.
